What is Present Tense?

What we use to talk about what is happening right now, habits and factual statements

What is an action verb?

A verb that is something that you physically or mentally do and generally control

How do we form Present Tense?

- 1. Take the 'etv' form
- 2. Drop the etv
- 3. Add the L-Grade to the final vowel
- 4. Add the Person Marker
- 5. Add an 's' on the end



What is a Stative Verb

A verb that is about a state you are in or experience. Usually something you don't control.

Remember how last week, I said that Mvskoke is a verb-centric language?

In Mvskoke, things we would consider "adjectives" in English actually act like verbs in Mvskoke. These fall under stative-verbs!

- to be happy
 to be sick
- to hurt

As you may have noticed, a lot of these start with "to be...." That can be a good way to guess if something may be a stative verb

• to be content to be angry to be scared

For Stative Verbs, it's most common to start with a consonant, e, ē or a

That means that memorizing the first column and the last column will probably be the most helpful in the beginning




