HOW DO WE MAKE IT MORE POLITE?

In Mvskoke, you can add 'epvs' instead to give the sentence a more polite feeling!

Homp<u>vs</u> (Eat) --> Homp<u>epvs</u> (Please eat)





DO WE ALWAYS NEED TO USE 'EPVS' TO NOT SOUND RUDE?

The short answer? No, you don't need to add the polite version all the time.

In Mvskoke, we tend to only add the polite form when we see a specific reason to be extra polite: talking to elders, guests, customers, etc. In everyday conversation, you don't need to add the polite all the time like you would in English.





Take the dictionary form

NEGATIVE COMMANDS

A Negative Command is used when you want to tell someone "don't" do something

Ex: Don't eat that

Hompetv

Drop the 'etv'

Homp

Add 'ekot' to the end

Homp<u>ekot</u>



SIMPLE COMMANDS TO GROUPS OF PEOPLE

In Mvskoke, commands end differently if we are telling one person to eat vs many people to eat

Hompetv

Drop the 'etv'

Homp

Add 'vks' to the end


Homp<u>vks</u>



SOME VERBS HAVE DJFFERENT FORMS FOR GROUPS OF PEOPLE

This concept doesn't really exist in English

It's common for verbs about movement or position (go, walk, run, stand, sit, etc), to have different forms depending on the number of people doing the action.

Liketv = to sit (I person)

This means that when we make a command with these verbs, we have to use the correct form for the amount of people and THEN add "vks"

Kaketv = Vpoketv = to sit to sit (2 people) (3+ people)


HERE ARE THE VERBS FROM YESTERDAY

The highlighted ones are verbs that have different forms for groups of people

- Hompetv = to eat
- Esketv = to drink
- Nocetv = to sleep
- Wiketv = to stop/cease doing something
- Fekhonnetv = to physically stop
- Mapohicetv = to listen



- Hueretv = to stand
- Yvkvpetv= walk
- Maketv = to say/speak
- Hecetv = to see/look



- Letketv = to run
- Liketv = to sit






